


DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:


In 2013 nearly 26,000 of you contributed more than \$3.45 million to the Annual Catholic Appeal. Fifty percent of funds collected went to charitable organizations helping nearly 120,000 people to overcome poverty and despair. Twenty-five percent went back to each of the 102 parishes so local parishioners could respond to a wide variety of needs in their neighborhoods. Twenty-five percent helped educate seminarians, and assisted families in the many at-risk communities to give their children a Catholic School education.

Now twenty-one seminarians are preparing themselves to serve God and His Church here in the Diocese of Sacramento. The journey towards priesthood starts with the calling, that is, when an unmarried man feels in his heart the invitation from God to be a priest of Christ. Formation includes four years of college focused in philosophy, two years of theology, a pastoral year (the experience of living in a parish for a school year), and another two years of theology.

Your support has allowed us to once again ensure the preservation of a supportive community for those who have committed themselves to this journey in service to Christ.


