Dear Friends in Christ:

January 22, 2018 marks the 45th anniversary of the lamentable 1973 U.S. Supreme Court Decision, Roe v. Wade. In prayerful observance, I designate January 22, 2018 as a Diocesan Day of Reparation.

I ask our clergy and laity to join me in cooperating with God's merciful grace in these ways:

January 20/21: clergy are asked to 1) pray and preach for a merciful end to abortion and a revived promotion of the gospel of life, and 2) encourage all to observe the January 22 Diocesan Day of Reparation.

January 22: all are asked to observe this Day of Reparation through fasting, prayer, penance and works of mercy.

January 22: all are invited to attend the 12:10 p.m. Cathedral Mass and priests are invited to concelebrate with me.

January 22/23: middle and high school students are invited to attend the Choose Life educational program in either Sacramento (1/22) or Yuba City (1/23)

January 27: all are encouraged to participate in the Walk for Life West Coast in San Francisco.

Saturday / Sunday, January 20 / 21, 2018

• Clergy are asked to 1) pray and preach for a merciful end to abortion and a revived promotion of the gospel of life, and 2) encourage all to observe the January 22 Diocesan Day of Reparation

Monday, January 22, 2018

Diocesan Day of Reparation

- All clergy and laity are asked to observe as a day of fasting, prayer, penance, and works of charity. For those able to fast, it is recommended that they limit themselves to one full meal. Those choosing to abstain may refrain from eating either meat or anything normally consumed as part of their daily routine.
- Works of charity are particularly encouraged: helping at food distribution centers, visiting the sick or imprisoned, and assisting at shelters for women and families in need.

Masses

- Priests are asked to offer their Masses for an end to abortion, using either 48/1 (Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life), 30A (For the Preservation of Peace and Justice) or 38A or B (For the Forgiveness of Sins).
- All are invited to attend the 12:10 p.m Cathedral Mass. Priests are encouraged to concelebrate this Mass with Bishop Soto. Please bring an alb and violet stole.

Choose Life program for youth (Cathedral)

- Middle and high school youth from our Catholic schools are invited to attend the Choose Life educational program at the Cathedral from 10 a.m. to noon on the *morning* of January 22. Contact Diocesan School Dept. for more information, 916-733-0110
