MENTORING RETURNING CITIZENS

EXODUS PROJECT offers spiritually-based mentoring for men and women of all faiths coming out of Sacramento County correctional facilities. Rooted in the teachings to care for the least among us, EXODUS PROJECT aims to be a bridge of support and compassion during the tenuous transition from incarceration back into the community. Beginning during the final months of incarceration, mentoring continues for six months post-release.

A HOLISTIC APPROACH

EXODUS PROJECT emphasizes human dignity, selfawareness, and an engaged spiritual and/or religious life. In one-on-one and group mentoring, mentors offer non-judgmental listening and encouragement. Mentors also provide logistical support to Participants looking to secure housing, healthcare, employment, education, and/or faith community involvement. Resources we provide include bus passes, furniture and clothing vouchers, and gas cards.


