General Summary

What is the primary purpose of this position?

The Long-Term Substitute Teacher for Spanish at St. Francis Catholic High School is responsible for teaching high school students in Spanish for a limited term. The St. Francis Teacher will be a passionate educator who is deeply committed to Catholic, faith-based education and student success. The teacher is a subject matter expert that knows how to build a positive classroom culture focused on learning, uses student learning data to drive his or her work, and delivers engaging rigorous instruction. The teacher is expected to implement the school mission and philosophy, to follow the policies of the Diocese of Sacramento, and to adhere to the directives set by school administration. This position is a temporary, non-exempt position.

Essential Responsibilities

- Providing student feedback and communicating effectively with students and families as appropriate;
- Attending FEP/SST meetings as appropriate;
- Participating in general supervision duties;
- Attending employee meetings, department meetings, collaboration meetings, staff meetings, liturgies, masses, assemblies, and school events;
- Complying with established safety guidelines.
