Recent studies continue to reveal that one of the reasons individuals consider a vocation to priesthood or religious life is because of a personal invitation.




Your personal invitation can make a difference in the future of the Church and in the Diocese of Sacramento!



SUGGESTIONS FOR INVITING PROSPECTIVE INDIVIDUALS

- "I am aware that you are a person who prays a lot and have seen you at Mass regularly. Have you every thought of priesthood or religious life?"
- "You appear to be so happy and joy-filled in your ministry of serving others. Have you ever thought of becoming a priest or a member of a religious community and giving your life in service to the Church?"
- "You seem to be thinking about the future and where your life might be leading you. Have you ever considered a vocation to the priesthood or religious life?"
- "I have observed your commitment and enthusiasm to many of our service programs. Have you ever considered a life of service as a priest, sister, religious, or deacon?"
- "You have so many gifts and talents and are very compassionate with others in the community. I am going to pray that you might consider dedicating your talents to serve the Church as a priest or religious."
- "I notice that you have many qualities in your character that would contribute greatly to our diocese. Have you ever considered a vocation in the Church?"
- "I have noticed you for some time at church functions and at Mass, and feel you would be an asset to the Church. Have you considered serving the Church on a full-time basis?"
- "Your gift of caring would certainly serve the Church well. I feel you would be a good priest/sister/brother/deacon. Have you ever thought of a vocation in the Church?"
- "You appear to be searching for meaning in your life. Are you willing to consider a religious vocation?"
- "I am pleased that you enjoy praying with us. Did you ever think of doing this on a continuous basis, perhaps every day, serving the Church as a priest, or religious?"
