The Coronavirus has impacted all of us for well over a year. Fortunately, the tide seems to be turning. **We send our thoughts and prayers to all the families who have lost a loved one during this pandemic.** While we cannot lessen the grief from losing a loved one, there may be a way to ease some of the financial loss due to a COVID-19 related death.

For families who have been impacted by COVID-19 related death, we want to make sure you are aware and take advantage of FEMA's (Federal Emergency Management Agency) Funeral Assistance Program.



This relief program was made possible by a combination of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Act of 2021.

If you lost a loved one due to COVID-19 on or after January 20, 2020, you may be eligible for financial assistance. You can reach FEMA Funeral assistance and apply by calling 844-684-6333. Click here for FEMA's checklist of items you need to gather. Types of services eligible for reimbursement include, but are not limited to, funeral services, embalming, decedent transportation, memorial marker, cremation, burial location, casket or urn purchase and many more items.

If you had a loved one cremated and have not laid them to rest, you may want to honor them with a burial or niche location and submit that purchase for reimbursement. If you laid a loved one to rest and have not selected a memorial marker or headstone yet, you may do so and submit that purchase for reimbursement.

Embalmer Apprenticeship...

Kimberly shares her journey on becoming an Embalmer and the Embalmer Apprenticeship program at St. Mary Cemetery & Funeral Center.

I was drawn to the funeral profession around the time I experienced a close death in my family. I had never considered this profession before. I was starting nursing school knowing that I wanted a career helping others. I couldn't stop thinking about the funeral professional who worked with my family



during our loss. They were so thoughtful and caring. I needed to do some research only to learn that this career was a perfect mix of all the things I had ever wanted to do, including art and science.

In the winter of 2019, I completed my Mortuary Science Program at American River College (ARC). California law requires embalmers to complete a two-year apprenticeship, embalm a minimum of 100 decedents, and pass licensing exams to obtain a license.

Catholic Funeral & Cemetery Services of the Diocese of Sacramento offers an apprenticeship program in which students receive hands-on experience under the direction of a licensed Embalmer. During my apprenticeship, I gained confidence in all aspects of caring for the body, including embalming, trauma restoration, cosmetics, and much more.

Nathan Skelton, my professor at ARC, suggested that I apply for the apprenticeship position at St. Mary Funeral Center, where he was once an embalmer himself. I reached out and so began my apprenticeship under Jonathan Biller, the Care Center Manager at St. Mary Funeral Center. Johnathan is a caring and intelligent individual who taught me more than just how to prepare decedents for viewings but how to model the behavior of a genuine person who cares especially during what is the hardest day of life for many people.

COVID-19 hit the funeral industry hard. I was only about halfway through my apprenticeship when the workload quickly became overwhelming. The Care Center and Funeral Department all work together very well by encouraging and supporting each other. This, along with the support and training I received from Jonathan, made this time of the pandemic a lot easier to manage.

This job can get incredibly emotional. But I remind myself that it needs to be done so the family can receive comfort. I try to give everyone the same amount of care and attention, whether they are young or old. I prepare decedents for their funeral services and I always love dressing someone up in their Sunday best, doing their hair and makeup for their final goodbye.

Cemetery Decoration Guidelines

Guidelines have been established to provide opportunities for families to decorate the resting places of loved ones while ensuring the safe and consistent maintenance of the cemetery. Here are examples of allowed and prohibited items and practices. This is a guideline intended to provide general direction to families and is not intended to encompass all potential situations.

Prohibited, broken or any item deemed to be hazardous to guest, staff or others will be removed and disposed of at the Cemetery's convenience and without notice to families. Wilted or dried flowers will be removed. The Cemetery is not responsible for lost, blown or stolen items under any conditions. The Cemetery reserves the right to remove any and all items at any time for any reason.

Approved Decorations

- Flowers in cemetery provided vases
- Potted plants and figurines on memorial
- · Solar lights placed at edge of memorial
- · Decorations less than 18" high





Prohibited Decorations

- Fencing, Rocks, and Physical Barriers
- · Potted plants and figurines on the grass
- Solar lights surrounding the grave
- · Decorations exceeding 18" high
- · Balloons or Glass Objects





The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is held every Saturday to pray for faithfully departed souls buried at our cemeteries.


