Construction Updates

Calvary Funeral Center

After several years of planning and permitting, construction of the Calvary Funeral Center is finally underway. Our contractors have completed demolition of the existing maintenance facility and walls and have completed a major portion of the earth-moving activities. The building pad is complete and the concrete foundation will be poured, in phases, over the coming weeks.



CFCS and our contractors have been very mindful of those laid to rest in the area, the protection of those resting places, and the need for family access. Holy Angels Lawn has had a boundary established and additional fencing installed to ensure construction activity and equipment do not enter the area. Holy Angels is within the work zone due to the need for road access to the construction site, but measures are in place to ensure family access. Anyone wishing to visit may check in at the Mausoleum office. There they will be provided with safety vests and hard hats and escorted to and from the lawn by CFCS staff. Access can be obtained during the regular Mausoleum office hours; Monday through Saturday 8:30am to 4:30pm.

Our cemetery grounds staff carefully removed and have stored the two statues that were previously placed within the construction area. At the completion of construction, the statues will be installed in new suitable areas.

The anticipated completion of the project and opening of the facility is early fall of 2022.

This is a very exciting time for CFCS and Calvary Cemetery because the new facility will greatly expand our ability to serve families within the Diocese of Sacramento.

All Souls – New Lawns

Construction on our new lawns at All Souls Cemetery began the first week of September. The new lawns are being constructed across from the Chapel of the Apostles Mausoleum. The lawns have been named after the Gospels; Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

These new lawns will provide the cemetery with over 400 new locations for families to choose from. Each lawn includes sections for upright memorials and ground level memorials. New roadways and walkways are also being constructed to ensure safe and easy access to all locations.
