Re: CalOES Non- profit security grant results

Earlier this month, CalOES announced the results of the FY2022 State non-profit security grant program. 285 non-profit organizations across the state were collectively awarded \$47.5 million dollars.

I am very pleased to report that 16 parishes and schools in the Sacramento Diocese were successful applicants and will be collectively awarded \$2,775,282.00 for target-hardening efforts designed to deter or reduce the consequences of a terrorist act. These security improvements have the added benefit of deterring other, more common types of criminal offences. This was a tremendous success, especially considering that this was the first opportunity for parishes to freely participate in this program.

The successful Sacramento Diocese facilities and the amounts rewarded to each facility are as follows:

Many of these applicants participated in our grant information sharing network within the diocese that included samples of successful grant applications and “question and answer” correspondence with CalOES. Some of the recent awardees have generously provided us their applications for this grant to assist future applicants. Funding for the federal homeland security grant program – which was announced last week - has consistently grown and will total \$305 million this year.
