Re: Notice of Funding Opportunity- 2025 Federal Non-profit Security Grant

Last week FEMA released the notice of funding opportunity (NOFO) for the annual federal non-profit security grant. CalOES operates as the state administrative agency for FEMA and manages a large component of this grant process (CalOES is considered the applicant for this grant; participating non-profit organizations are “sub-applicants” through CalOES). .

Previously CalOES instructed non-profits to submit applications to them two weeks BEFORE the deadline listed in the FEMA NOFO. This allowed CalOES to review California’s applications before they were sent to FEMA for consideration. The deadline listed in the 2025 NOFO for CalOES to submit their application to FEMA is August 11.

Based upon previous practice, CalOES **MAY** require non-profits to submit their individual applications to CalOES before August 11. As of the Friday August 1 publication deadline for this memo, **CalOES has not distributed any information or instructions to potential applicants about this NOFO.**

Reports have documented confusion and frustration surrounding funding for FEMA and its grant programs, including this non-profit security grant, over the course of this year. It appears as if FEMA’s sudden announcement of this NOFO coupled with the extremely short deadline for submission have impacted CalOES’s communications about this opportunity.

I have been told CalOES’s instructions for this grant are forthcoming – again, I have no additional information regarding non-profit applicant deadlines or submission instructions for this grant from CalOES.

Funding Opportunity

Today, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), a component of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), announced the availability of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP). The NOFO released today represents \$274.5 million in available federal assistance and may be found online at <http://www.fema.gov/grants> and at <http://www.grants.gov>.

The FY 2025 NSGP provides \$274.5 million to support facility hardening and other physical security enhancements and activities to nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of a terrorist or other extremist attack. Of this amount, \$137.25 million is available to nonprofit organizations located within one of the FY 2025 designated high-risk urban areas (NSGP-Urban Area or NSGP-UA). Additional, separate funding in the amount of \$137.25 million is also appropriated for nonprofit organizations located outside of the FY 2025 designated high-risk urban areas (NSGP-State or NSGP-S). Eligible applicants must apply for funding through the FEMA Grants Outcomes (FEMA GO) system portal at <http://go.fema.gov/>, where required forms and information must be submitted. Sample Standard Forms (SFs) are also available at <https://grants.gov/forms/forms-repository/sf-424-family>. State Administrative Agencies (SAA) are the only eligible applicants for NSGP.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to begin the application process as soon as possible, including obtaining a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) number. The UEI is a 12-character alphanumeric identification assigned to an entity by the System for Award Management (see SAM.gov). The UEI is required for applicants and may take up to four weeks to obtain. To obtain the UEI, all applicants must register with SAM.gov. Failure to register with SAM.gov will prevent an applicant from completing the application in FEMA GO. Instructions on how to request a UEI can be found at <https://sam.gov/content/entity-registration>.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to begin their application in FEMA GO at the time of this announcement to ensure they have adequate time to start and complete their submission.

Completed applications must be submitted in FEMA GO no later than **5 p.m. Eastern Time (ET), on August 11, 2025**. Only final submissions made through the FEMA GO system located at <http://go.fema.gov/> will be accepted. If you, the applicant, need assistance registering for the FEMA GO system, please contact the FEMA GO Helpdesk at femago@fema.dhs.gov or (877) 585-3242, Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. – 6 p.m. ET.

FEMA will evaluate applications and make awards no later than September 30, 2025.
