



Essential Needs of a Thriving Gabriel Project Parish Ministry



Meeting Space

Thriving Gabriel Projects meet at times bi-weekly, most commonly once a month for a couple of hours. Meetings enable GP angels to build comradery, coordinate services for moms, obtain on-going guidance & training, problem solve to make the ministry stronger, and grow in faith through prayer for each other and GP moms.



Storage Space

To maximize parish community involvement & increase the availability of resources, a storage space is ideal for storing items that are often donated such as diapers, wipes, lightly used baby clothing, & other items in good condition.



Parish Fundraising

Gabriel project angels are encouraged to have a donor email list to request items needed by GP moms from the parish community. They are encouraged to have a fund and have fundraisers (e.g., bake sale, donation drives.) For monetary contributions, a fund overseen by the parish finance council or responsible party's should be established.



Gabriel Project Sign

A Gabriel Project sign to be displayed at the parish will signal to the community that help for pregnant women in need can be found there. It will advertise the 1-800 number and the outreach available to the community.
